

Code of Conduct /Responsibilities for parents/Guardians

Parents/Guardians are expected to:

- Complete and return Registration forms allowing their child's participation in the Crumlin United Youth Academy
- Deliver and collect their child punctually at matches/training
- Ensure their child is adequately clothed for the weather conditions
- Ensure their child is wearing appropriate footwear and shin pads at matches/training
- Detail any health/behavioural concerns on the registration form
- Inform the team coach if their child has been hurt recently
- Reply to coach text messages as soon as possible regards their child's availability for matches (2 days at the latest)
- Encourage their child to play by the rules and teach them to try their best
- Avoid coaching/shouting at their child during matches and training
- Accept the coaches'/referees judgements
- Promote their child's participation in playing for fun and not win at all costs
- Behave responsibly at the side line and set a good example for their child
- Encourage children to show respect to their coach, team mates and opponents
- Not place their child under pressure or push them into activities they do not want to do
- Never punish or belittle their child for losing or making mistakes
- Discuss any issues with the coach appropriately and where possible in private (phone call or quiet word) and not in full view of other teams or parents
- Be realistic and supportive of your child and the coach
- If you have an issue with another child as a result of an incident at training/matches, do not approach their parent- let the coach know and we will deal with the issue accordingly
- Don't try to talk to the coach during matches/ training
- Remain within the designated area during your child's match
- CUFC kit/match tops should be worn for matches only

Do not try and coach your child from the side lines- this is the job of the coach

Parents have the right to:

- Know their child is safe and be informed if their child is injured
- Be informed of problems or concerns relating to their child
- Be informed of any changes to with the child's team
- Be informed of any issues that arise within the team
